This Show will be on Stoneleigh Road, Warwickshire CV8 3AY. We invite you to participate.

**Directions:** The Show will be sign posted on B4115 and A46. Please also refer to our website giving directions.

**Staging of Exhibits:**

**Friday 2nd June 2023** Entries will be accepted between 5.00 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. Exhibitors wishing to unload directly into the Homecraft Marquee must do so on the Friday. Entrance gates may be changed due to weather conditions.

**Saturday 3rd June 2023** **Entries will be accepted between 8.00am and strictly 8.30am Exhibits brought on the Saturday will have to be carried from the car park, as no cars will be allowed near the Homecraft Marquee.**

**Judging:**

**Saturday 3rd June 2023** Judging will take place from 9.00 a.m.

The Homecraft Show will be open to the public from approximately 11.00 a.m., after the judging has been completed.

**Presentation of Prize and Collection of Exhibits:**

**Saturday 3rd June 2023** Presentation of trophies will take place in the Homecraft Marquee at 4.30 p.m. Prize money will be available from the Secretary after 5.00 p.m. All exhibits must be removed by 6.00 p.m.

## **RULES:**

1. **Entry Fees:**  
Children's Section (Division XI) – 30p per entry: All other Classes – 60p per entry
2. **Your Entry Form:**  
Accompanied by the correct entry fee must be received by **Monday 29th May 2023**.  
Confirmation of entry will not be acknowledged. Please see Page 1 for details.
- 2a. Due to time restrictions on show day, entry forms not received by the closing date will only be accepted at the Chairman's discretion. **Late entries** will only be accepted if the exhibitor has already entered exhibits in the show, and in Sections II and III due to seasonal growing conditions.
3. **Entrants in Division XI must be:**  
PART I: 7 years or under. PART II: 12 years or under. PART III & IV: 18 years or under on the day of the Show. **ENTRANTS MUST BE UNAIDED BY ADULTS.**
4. All classes are open.  
**NB** - An exhibitor may not enter more than 2 entries per class in Division IV, Egg Section; Division VIII, Handicraft Section; Division IX, Art Section; and Division XI, Part IV Children's Egg Class.
5. **Any item may be exhibited in one KADAS Homecraft Show only and must not be re-entered in any other year.**
6. The committee has the right to refuse entries.
7. The Judges have the power to withhold prizes. **The Judges' decision is final.**
8. Protests or objections to be made in writing by the Exhibitor to the Show Secretary by 1.00 p.m. on the day of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £5.00, returnable if the objection is held.
9. All entries for the **COMPETITION ONLY, AND NO ARTICLE WILL BE SOLD.**
10. All exhibits showing more or less than the specified number, greater than the stated maximum dimensions or otherwise not to schedule, shall be disqualified.
11. Cards for each entry to be obtained from the Secretary on arrival at the Homecraft Marquee.  
**Please note: Entries will not be accepted after 7.30 p.m. on Friday 2nd June, and 8.30 a.m. on Saturday 3rd June.**
12. Exhibitors to provide own materials for staging exhibits and to be responsible for same at close of Show.  
**New Rule:** All exhibits must be anonymous and exhibits must be named on the reverse. Items not collected after the show will be donated to Charity
13. Although all possible security precautions will be taken, the Kenilworth and District Agricultural Society accept no responsibility for loss or damage to exhibits or the property of the Exhibitor.
14. **Placings:** Classes with 5 or fewer entries qualify for 3 awards.  
Classes with 6 or more entries qualify for 4 or 5 awards.
15. Points will be awarded as follows:- **1st - 4 2nd - 2 3rd - 1**
16. Where an Exhibitor enters more than one exhibit in a single class, the points gained by the highest placed exhibit **ONLY** will be calculated towards the 'Most Points in Division' trophy, unless there is a tie when points will be taken into account for 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> placings.
17. Trophies are the property of the Kenilworth and District Agricultural Society. They are for annual competition. Winners from the previous show will be notified accordingly, and the trophies **must be returned** to the Secretary by the 30<sup>th</sup> April 2024 for presentation at the 2024 show.  
**New Rule:** It is the responsibility of trophy winners to ensure that they are returned in a clean condition, fit for presentation to the next holder. The Society will charge the holder for the cost of professional cleaning if this is not done.
18. No dogs allowed in marquee, except guide dogs.

Tables are 60cms in depth, covered white. All backings are neutral where applicable. Height of exhibits is unlimited. No artificial plant material to be included. **Please note that staging must be completed by 7.30 p.m. Friday 2nd June 2023.**

#### **CLASS:**

1. "Village Allotment" to include garden flowers and vegetables/fruit. An exhibit. Width 24".
2. Walt Disney Celebration of 100 Years. An exhibit. Width 30".
3. A Table Centre to incorporate a Candle(s). An exhibit. Width 30".
4. A wired Wedding Accessory for a Bridesmaid or Wedding Guest.
5. A Line Arrangement using 5 flowers and foliage. Width 18" (Novice – someone who has never won a floral arrangement competition)

### **DIVISION II - POT PLANTS / HERBS / VEGETABLES**

**Pot Plants must have been the property of the Exhibitor for a minimum of 3 months, and not have been shown previously in the KADAS Homecraft Show. See Note 5**

#### **CLASS:**

7. One Herb grown in a pot – pot to be 7"/18cm Maximum
8. 1 Foliage plant – pot to be 7"/18cm Maximum
9. 1 Flowering Pot Plant - pot to be 7"/18cm Maximum
10. Flowering Orchid growing in a Pot - pot to be 7"/18cm Maximum
11. Hosta grown in a pot – pot to be 8"/20cm maximum. Small & medium leaf varieties.
12. Hosta grown in a pot – pot more than 8"/20cm
13. A Planted Novelty Patio Container. Max container size 18"/46cm
14. 3 Sticks of Rhubarb
15. Carnivorous Plant display. Max space 12"/30cm x 12"/30cm
16. 6 Stems of Asparagus

Entries in this section, except in Classes 14 & 16, will not be accepted unless - **standing in a water retaining dish.**

### **DIVISION III - CUT FLOWERS**

**All Cut Flowers must have been grown by the Exhibitor.**

**DIVISION IV – EGGS – An exhibitor may not enter more than two entries per class in this section. Classes 27-31 will be judged on appearance only.**

## Class 33

### STICKY STEM GINGER CAKE WITH LEMON ICING

#### Ingredients:

225g Self Raising Flour  
1 tsp Bicarbonate of soda  
1 tbsp Ground Ginger  
1 tsp Ground Cinnamon  
1 tsp Mixed Spice  
115g Butter, cut into cubes (plus extra for greasing)  
115g Soft Dark Brown Sugar  
115g Black Treacle  
115g Golden Syrup  
250ml Whole Milk  
85g Drained Stem Ginger, finely grated  
1 egg

For the Icing:  
50g Icing Sugar, sifted  
1 tsp finely grated Lemon Zest  
1 tbsp Lemon Juice

Butter and line an 18cm round, 7cm deep cake tin.  
Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan/Gas 4.

Place flour, bicarbonate of soda and all the spices into a large mixing bowl. Add the butter and rub into the flour until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs.

Put the sugar, treacle, syrup and milk into a saucepan and heat gently stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Turn up the heat and bring the mixture to just below boiling point.

Add the stem ginger to the flour mixture, then pour in the treacle mixture stirring as you go with a wooden spoon. Break in the egg and beat until all the mixture is combined and it resembles a thick pancake batter. Pour this into prepared tin and bake for 50 mins – 1 hour, until a skewer comes out fairly clean. Leave to cool completely in the tin before turning the cake out.

Icing: Sieve icing sugar into a bowl, add lemon zest and juice. Mix well. Spread evenly onto cake top.
